Also it must be clean and tidy and even better if it has some original architectural features (e.g. wooden beams with carvings). If the pub also does food this is served in a separate area away from the bar, and when I walk up to the bar I don't want to be asked 'have you booked a table sir!' With a very special landlord and landlady that address you by name (if you are a regular) and know what choice of drinks you tend to go for. They encourage community spirit and group visits/activities for locals away from the pub and don't put up with any inappropriate behaviour in their pub.
