More pubs are facing last orders

In one form or another, pubs have been a part of Britain's social fabric since Roman times as places to gather, socialise, entertain and even bolster each other in the toughest of times. They're a precious part of everyday life and their appeal remains undiminishedbut that could all change! William Robinson, co-owner of 6th-generation family-run Robinson Brewery stated their pubs stayed open during the Spanish flu, and through both world wars. Their pubs have only closed once in their 300-year history, to abide by the Covid lockdown.

Five per cent of pubs closed for good in 2020 and another five per cent are set to close in 2021.- that's 5.000 pubs gone and who knows what will happen in 2022. Emma McClarkin, Chief Executive of the British Beer & Pub Association stated "We could be entering some of the bleakest months ahead Businesses are on the line"

Samuel Pepys (one time MP for Harwich) aptly described the pub as the "heart of England" - a focal point of our communities. We mustn't let Covid rip the heart out of our local communities forever.
