We hope our visit encourages customers to visit their local and what can be more quintessentially English than a pint or two in a village local watching Leading Lights Morris perform traditional dances. Below are a few of our proposed events please let me know if you are interested and if there is enough support I will set dates and advertise again.

The Dove Ipswich Transport by minibus would be around £10 each.

Little Earth Project (The White Horse Edwardstone) Transport by minibus would be around £11 each. A bit off the beaten track and found along the South Suffolk Cycle route, you'll find an oasis of great beer found in a traditional styled Suffolk freehouse.

Sudbury - a summer Saturday daytime country walk ending at The Nethergate Brewery Tap (with an option for a brewery show round). Transport by minibus would be around £11 each. The walk is 3 miles along a disused railway line so should be level ground. The minibus will drop us off in Sudbury and pick us up at the brewery. The Valley Trail runs through the Sudbury riverside meadows, which are the oldest continuously grazed pastures in East Anglia. The majority of these have been part of the Sudbury Common Lands Charity since 1897 and are traditionally managed.
