The Harwich ship-master Thomas Thompson was renown nation-wide, he rose to be one of six "principal masters of the Navy" – a position of high responsibility. There was a dash of the pirate in his make-up, the greatest moment of his career came in 1592 when he sailed into Harwich harbour in a vessel owned by Sir John Hawkins- the Dainty - with her holds full of Spanish treasure. Skipper and crew paraded the streets with their spoils, and the day, with its auction sales, tavern brawls and singing of sea shanties, was remembered for decades after. ~ From Discovering the Essex Coast by Rudolph

It takes a hardy breed to stand around throwing sausages on a cold day but Tendring CAMRA proved they are up to the job for the sixth Harwich Sausage Festival on Saturday 5th November. The throwing competition and public taste-off were both very close this year. The throwing was won by reigning champion Nick Aldridge on his second throw but two new throwers came within 6 feet of his winning 132 feet. In the public tasting the Alma won the Innovation Class and Smiths Butchers of Brightlingsea won the Butchers Class with Primrose Pork of Great Bromley and Shaws Farm Meats of Dovercourt Market tying for second place. Smiths Butchers of Brightlingsea narrowly beat off the competition to be named Harwich Champion Sausage on their first attempt. Once again the festival proved that the public are interested in real sausages, real ale and real cider and they enjoy a day out in our pubs.

It is that time of year again when we ask you to choose your favourite pubs (max of 12) from our top list of pubs that is maintained throughout the year at branch meetings. Once votes are tallied the top nine will be submitted as entries for the 2018 Good Beer Guide. The top five will also go forward as our 2017 Pub of the Year shortlist - the form for that will be available from the members area of our website soon after this round of voting closes.
