This year's 27th Clacton-on-Sea Real Ale & Cider Festival took place at St. James' Hall, Tower Road, Clacton-on-Sea. It was a great success with loads of positive feedback from the customers and volunteers alike.

However, we do have a problem with an ageing band of volunteers for set-up and take-down. I do sincerely hope we can continue running the festival. However, we must decide how we overcome this problem. We may need to scale back the festival? Decisions will have to be made at our meetings on 21st September at the Old Lifeboat House and 24th October at the Haywain. It would be great if more CAMRA members could attend and take part in the discussion.

Our festival charity this year was St Helena Hospice, and we raised £600 for this great local charity. We sold 3,444 pints of ale and had almost 1,000 customers. There were 52 votes for our Beer of the Festival; in joint second was Okapi brewed by 'Grain' of Norfolk and Voller brewed by 'Only With Love' of East Sussex. In first place was P2 Porter brewed by 'Gruff' of Suffolk. There were 17 votes for our Cider of the Festival; in second place was Bakewell Tart by 'SeaCider' and in first place was Old Harry Rocks by 'Dorset Nectar'.

During October there are a number of things you could get involved in. The Shanty Festival takes place in Harwich on 11th to 13th October. Cravat Day is on Friday 18th October when members can do their own thing and make a fashion statement wearing a cravat in their favourite local. Trafalgar Day on Monday 21st October. Depending on numbers I could arrange transport to The Trafalgar in Dovercourt. Celebrating Nelson's great victory.
