Cheers and laughter filled the air at this year's 28th Clacton-on-Sea Real Ale & Cider Festival, where community spirit and a shared love of fine brews united crowds from near and far, with over 4,000 pints consumed during the festival. The festival was nothing short of a triumph for organisers and attendees alike.

The event featured a wide variety of local and regional ales, with the Three Brothers Raspberry Ripple Icecream Porter earning the distinction of being the first beer to sell out—a testament to its popularity among festival-goers. In a tightly contested vote, the coveted title of "Beer of the Festival" resulted in a tie between the Three Brothers brewery (County Durham) Raspberry Ripple Icecream Porter and Three Acre brewery (East Sussex) Mighty Mosaic Pale, highlighting the diverse tastes and preferences of the Clacton crowd.

Not to be overshadowed cider enthusiasts were treated to the festivals standout selection. Falcon Punch from Twisted (Dorset) took home the 'Cider of the Festival' accolade.

Our festival charity this year was 'The Saturday Drop-in' at St James Church, they will be receiving £300.
