


Branch Activities

We had a good range of beers and this year we had a Yorkshire beer corner supplied from small brewers in the county. The poster we used was produced by Gemma Taylor the daughter of local CAMRA activist Ed. Gemma is doing a course in Illustration at the University of Gloucestershire in Cheltenham. The image was based on internet research including an old railway poster of a Sheffield steel works, a photo of a South Yorkshire valley, and an image of people walking home from a coal mine. Colchester CAMRA have a Yorkshire Corner at their summer festival next year, and they may use the same poster. You will note we smashed the 500 members barrier with 26 new members joining at the festival. Colchester Brewery's 'Brazilian' won Beer of the Festival, Mersea Island's 'Oyster Stout' was second and Kelham Island's 'King of the Rocket Men' was third.
